
Fellowship Opportunities


Sunday Fellowship Snacks

Mission trip to Tanzania

We have began making plans for a Mission trip to Tanzania in 2026. I talked with Bishop Yohana Nzelu of the Southeast of Lake Victoria diocese last week. He suggested the mission be during the week of May 18-24th. If we were do mission at that time it would mean, we would have to leave the USA on Thursday May 14th and if some team members wanted to go on Safari after Mission week that would result in leaving Tanzania on tues or Wednesday night May 26 or 27th.

I explained to Bishop that might be too early for some to go because of high school graduations. He asked us to suggest dates that would work for us.

The Diocese is planning for our mission trip would be in the villages of Mwamadulu and Mihama in the Kishapu District. In the past we have been in the Kishapu District but never in these remote villages that may have not had esposure to the gospel.

In addition to church planting, we will probably visit the Buhangiji Albino Center in Shinyanga, the medical clinic at the cathedral, the deaconess home for young albino women, the Mwadui Lutheran secondary School and the group homes for albino children built by St John Lutheran Church -Bingen, IN and the Mwadui Lutheran Secondary school.
